

## Katie's Café

The newest group meeting at St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church in Falls City, Nebraska is not your typical group. We're not a youth group, although some of could still be in one. We're not a circle group, although some of our members attend those too. We are a cafe group: Katie's Cafe to be specific.



Our group, which officially consists of members ranging in age from sixteen to somewhere in their 80's (although several of our most devoted attendees have been attending since before birth) and includes women from several local churches (not all Lutheran). We meet monthly for church duties (folding newsletters and cleaning the sanctuary), devotions from www.boldcafe.org, fellowship, and to plan projects. Our main focus at this time is raising money to help offset the cost of funeral dinners put on by circle groups at our churches. You may be wondering why we felt we needed a separate a group away from the circles and the answer is pretty easy: time. Most of our local circles meet during the day and take on church duties that require them to be available during the day such as funeral lunches, visiting, etc. As (mostly) working women and moms, that just wasn't a time that we were available to help out, but we still felt a desire to do something. Katie's Cafe offers us a time once a month where we can meet in fellowship and help out our local churches and others in our community.

### In Memory of Beth Bohling



For the past several years, the Women of the ELCA have been encouraging women to "Be Bold" in their faith. Beth Bohling could have been described as "bold" long before the campaign began.

Beth was bold to show up.

She went to church, NSWO board meetings, Bible studies, Spring Gatherings, Winter Retreats, and Conventions. [Above quoted from May 2009 *Expressions*]

Southeast Conference Spring Gathering was held at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Falls City on March 7, a total of ninety-five were registered. After gathering music, lead by Elysia McGill and welcoming from Sharon Ebke, Conference Coordinator and Carol Bierman, St. Paul's W/ELCA President, three NSWO officers were introduced: Kandy Pflaster, President; Joanne Rohrs, Treasurer; and Beth Meyer, Secretary/Convention Chair along with Elysia McGill, Southeast Conference Board Representative. Gwen Edwards. W/ELCA Churchwide Executive Board member was also introduced.

Worship with Communion was led by Pastor Andrew Chavanak from the host church. Our guest speaker Pastor Bob Bryan, Director of Prison Ministry for the Nebraska Synod and Pastor of Followers of Christ at the State Penitentiary, informed us of the services available for the prisoners and those in transition. A special offering was taken to be given to the Prison Ministry. After lunch, Pastor Megan Morrow, Assistant to the Bishop lead us in a Bible study. We also heard from Heather Abbott representative from NLOM about the quilt project at Camp Carol Joy and Bryon Line, Lutheran Family Services of Nebraska about AT EASE. Tangible offerings of personal and baby care items were collected and donated to SENCA, to be distributed to whose in need from the area. Newly elected Coordinator, Planning Committee and Nominating Committee members were introduced and installed by President Kandy Pflaster. Chris Ruzicka, W/ELCA co-President at American Lutheran Fairbury invited the group to join them next year for the 2016 Spring Gathering.

Northeast Conference Spring Gathering was held on March 14 at Grace Lutheran Church in West Point. The day's theme "Doing Good to All!" was carried out and presented in a variety of ways throughout the day. Guests were greeted by wonderful displays to visit, coffee and baked goodies. Gathering music by Grace's Praise Team welcomed the attendees into the Sanctuary to begin the day. NSWO officers present were introduced: Kandy Pflaster, President and JoAnn Rohrs, Treasurer. The business meeting included Roll Call of Churches, election and installation of the Conference Coordinator-Dorothy Wert, Planning Committee-JoAnn Kumm, Carol Nordby, Marlene Hansen, Marci Bartels and Nominating Committee-Marge Stottler, Lyla Swanson, Sandy Boots, Janice Roeber, as well as the President's and Treasurer's reports. The tangible offering received went to The Bridge, of Fremont. The featured speaker, Mary Lou Erickson aka Lena the Cleaning Lady, shared her ministry of laughter and smiles. With a Swedish accent, Lena told funny stories and crazy tales about her and her family...even how President Obama had recently called upon her for her services "because she can clean up anything!" Two sessions of four workshops were offered, they included (1) Making a quilt; (2) LFS At Ease; (3) Women's Health, and (4) Global Health Ministries and LWR Kits. A sit down catered meal was served by the Grace Lutheran Luther League. Following the second workshop, attendees were welcomed back to the sanctuary with music by the Praise Team and a greeting from NLOM. The Rev. Gary Panko, Assistant to the Bishop of the Nebraska Synod, led the Bible study from Galatians based on the theme and the theme verse, Galatians 6:9-10 focusing primarily on using our freedom in Christ to serve one another. A final financial report and report of attendance were given. The four quilts that were assembled in the workshops were shown and it was reported that 360 bandages had been rolled. The quilts will be sent to the Carol Joy Holling annual quilt auction and the bandages will be sent to LWR. 

Becky Sells encouraged us in our discipleship through Bible study and worship, and First Lutheran-Kearney invited the Conference to Kearney in 2016. It was good for us to hear how the program is working in Mo's life as he told us about the struggles he deals with. Pastor Steve Meysing had some challenges of his own. He brought a great Bible study to us despite his technical difficulties and commended us for choosing a second year of Galatians. We had some special guests as well. A giant M&M promoting the W/ELCA convention of "The Power of M," and Katie Luther (Martins' wife) who is around 500-years-old now, visited us. It was a great day with thirty-one participants.
