In My Mother's Bible

As I was looking through my mother's Bible the other day I notice a sheet of paper that was actually an article from some publication printed on August 6, 1982. The author of the article titled "Learn the ABC's of the Bible" was Margaret Bredberg Harrington. She writes about the importance of memorizing Scripture so when you are in a situation with no Bible in hand, you will have Scripture to recall. She mentioned Kathryn Koob, a former hostage in Iran, spoke often about the value of Scripture memorization. During her captivity, the verses she had memorized were a constant reminder of God's love.

At my mother's memorial service the pastor mentioned that when he would go to visit my mom and dad in the nursing home, he would ask my mom to recite a Bible verse that started with a certain letter and she could always honor his request. He said he didn't know how she could do this, but now I know. She had this whole list.

The Scripture references are all from the Revised Standard Version unless otherwise noted. Here is the list:

All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. Romans 3:23

Be faithful unto death, and I will give you the crown of life. Rev. 2:10b

Come to me, all who labor and are heavy-laden, and I will give you rest. Matt. 11:28

With a stronger endowment, Katie's Fund will generate more dollars each year to support leadership development, global connections, and living theology.

Now I want to "toot" the horn for our faithful, generous Lutheran women of Nebraska. At our convention in September the President of ELCA Women, Jenny Micheal announced that Nebraska was the leader in the Nation in the 25th Anniversary Appeal which supported in part the ELCA Malaria Campaign. You and I made a difference in the lives of many suffering or in the education/prevention of malaria. So here goes my challenge Will you write that check for \$25 to NSWO/Katie's Fund. The endowment is currently at \$830,000, but Nebraska can prove to be a key supporter in 2014 Katie's Fund. I will share more with you at Spring Gatherings. It is my dream that when many women from Nebraska travel to Charlotte, NC, that Nebraska will be recognized for our compassion, love, and energy to serve others through Christ.

The **Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America** are coming together in 2014 for Triennial Gathering in Charlotte, North Carolina. This dynamic event July 24-27, 2014 will not disappoint any woman who attends, as it will uplift and move one to spiritual fulfillment and a greater understanding of one's personal faith journey. SO, get into action now to join Lutheran Women from around the world at this world-class event.

Our NSWO awarded five scholarships on November 22, to cover the registration cost of Triennial Gathering. The winners were Young Woman - Caitlin Bennett/Elgin; First Timers - Sandy Terry/Fremont and Kim Hall/Lincoln, and General - Jane Flores/Hooper and Carol Stark/Cozad. Congratulations to these ladies! The scholarships paid for their \$325 early registration. They are responsible for their room, plane fare, meals, and other expenses while at the Triennial Gathering.

As of December 19, Churchwide had 695 people registered (that does not include 189 women who pre-registered in 2011 but have not yet completed registration for Triennial Gathering 2914). If you add them in, we have 884 registered. The City tour is proving most popular with 292 already signed up for it. Some other numbers include: 109 have signed up for Run, Walk, & Roll, 114 have become a "friend of the gathering" (with a total of \$2,775 contributed), 72 have volunteered to help with the gathering, and 62 signed up for the choir.

Ten rooms have been booked at the Westin Hotel across the street from the Convention Center for any ladies who would like to stay together with the NSWO Board Reps and Officers. Let me know if you are interested in staying with us. I would love to see at least seventy-five of us from Nebraska in attendance. It would be fun to have 100 of us there!! Keep talking up going.

Registration fee is \$350.00 starting January 9th, 2014.

As a result of their experience in the program of applied Feminist Spirituality under the direction of Professor Miriam Therese Winter, MMS, their love of knitting/crocheting has been combined into a prayerful ministry and spiritual practice, which reaches out to those in need of comfort and solace, as well as in celebration and joy. Many blessings are prayed into every shawl.

Whether they are called Prayer Shawls, Comfort Shawls, Peace Shawls or Mantles, etc..., the shawl maker begins with prayers and blessings for the recipient. The intentions are continued throughout the creation of the shawl. Upon completion, a final blessing is offered before the shawl is sent on its way. Some recipients have continued the kindness by making a shawl and passing it onto someone in need. Thus, the blessing ripples from person-to-person, with both the giver and the receiver feeling the unconditional embrace of a sheltering, mothering God.

THE PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY at AMERICAN LUTHERAN IN COZAD

The following article was a bulletin insert at American Lutheran to tell the story of the ladies who do the Prayer Shawl Ministry. Four years ago last November, Pat Halouska was given a prayer shawl from her daughter's church in Lincoln, NE as she was preparing to have major surgery at Mayo Clinic for her Trigeminal Neuralgia. Being brought out from surgery, her daughter placed the prayer shawl next to her in the bed. Each time Pat would feel pain or anxiety, she placed her hand on the shawl and received peace and comfort, unlike any other feeling she had ever felt.

After returning home, Pat asked the Women's Circle, if they could start a Prayer Shawl Ministry. Marge Wolf said she would help and the Prayer Shawl Ministry started at American Lutheran in Cozad. After receiving a Prayer Shawl, Mavis Beavers joined the group and then Donna Ackerman joined.

Recently a member of our ministries took a prayer shawl to a woman who has been diagnosed with breast cancer. This lady immediately put the shawl around her shoulders and thanked our member for the shawl. Her husband came into the house at that time and she showed it to him and told him to read the attached tag. After reading the tag, he took his glasses off to wipe tears from his eyes, put his head in his hands and told the member how wonderful this ministry was.

Pat Halouska took a prayer shawl to her sister, who was in a care home in North Platte. She explained what the shawl was and that it had been blessed by the Women's Circle and the Pastor of our church. . Since Pat's sister was in the early stages of dementia, each time Pat would visit she would put the shawl around her sister's shoulders. Pat would explain again what the shawl was and what it meant. About three months before Pat's sister passed away, every time Pat would visit, her sister would have her prayer shawl either around her or on her lap. Her sister would say, "I feel so good and safe when this shawl is around me." The nurse happened to enter the room while Pat was there and said, "Yes, if she can't find the shawl, she starts yelling for a nurse to find it." Pat's sister passed away the last of June and since she loved her shawl so much, she was buried with it.

A friend was losing her husband this past fall, so Pat took a prayer shawl to her and her friend asked if she could give it to her husband, until the casket was closed, then she would bring the shawl home with her. Pat told her that they could give one to her and him. However the friend said she just wanted one, but for it to be with him, as long as possible. She told Pat that it meant so much to her, as it was in his hands until the very end.

A baby shawl was given to a member who said that she places it on her baby while riding in the car, as babies need prayers while in the car. Several times when prayer shawls are given to people they have tears in their eyes or cry. It is hard to know who receives the most blessings; the giver or the receiver. Several shawls have been given to people who are hurting in many ways; illness, bereavement, needing comfort or happiness.

Making, praying over, and giving Prayer Shawls has brought many blessings to the Prayer Shawl Ministry. Anyone is invited to join the Prayer Shawl Ministry of Marge Wolf, Mavis Beavers, Donna Ackerman, Pastor Mike Parsh, or Pat Halouska.

Tanzanian Treasures is a mission project of St Matthew Lutheran Church in Omaha, Nebraska. Our purpose is to provide scholarships for women in Tanzania, East Africa.

We have booths at quilt shows, church events, give programs, teach classes, conduct Tanzanian Fabric, Fun, and Facts, a 3 Day Retreat. We sell Tanzanian fabric, commercial and hand dyed. Some fabric is dyed by

our students. We carry batik artwork, clothing, jewelry, aprons, purses, photos, note cards, baskets and more. Mary Mayfield also designs patterns, make samples, and makes kits of the Tanzanian Fabrics. 50% of the price of each item goes to the Women's Scholarship Fund.

Tanzanian Treasures grew out of our partnership with Tella Lutheran Parish which is located 7½ miles up a dirt road on Mt. Kilimanjaro. Scholarships are provided to the Angaza Women's Training Center run by the Women's Work Department of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania, the Mount Kilimanjaro area in East Africa. We also have a three-year scholarship available to the Machame School of Nursing.
