Devotions

I am getting really tired of winter. One of our local weather forecasters has a practice of eventually "putting a fork in winter." That hasn't happened yet, so he thinks there is still more to come. But spring will soon be here to stay.

This is a good time to take stock of ourselves and resolve to take better care of our bodies. Our church has been participating the Daniel Plan. This plan, developed by Pastor Rick Warren, Dr. Daniel Amen, M.D.. and Dr. Mark Hyman, M.D., stresses five essential areas in which we need to become more healthy. They are faith, food, fitness, focus, and friends.

We need to be caretakers of our bodies because God gave us our bodies and they are temples of the Holy Spirit. We need to be sure we eat right, get enough rest, and get moving.

Some of us are sure to eat right, but ignore our spiritual side; and others of us are spiritually healthy, but pay no attention to the kinds of foods we consume. It isn't easy. Even after we learn what is right, we stumble. God will guide us, if we ask. Spending time in prayer is the only way we can do this.

Eating right means starting the day with protein, eating at regular intervals (not skipping meals), and eating quality foods. Reading labels is essential. If nothing else, we should stay away from high fructose corn syrup, trans fats/hydrogenated fats, and MSG. One piece of advice is that if your great grandmother would not have recognized it as food, you should not eat it, either. Another is that if it grew on a plant it is food, but if it was produced

in a plant, it is not good for you.

The fitness essential works like this: The best form of exercise is something that you will actually do. Find something you enjoy doing and that gets you moving and find a buddy to do it with you. Remember that caring for your body is an act of worship and of stewardship.

The focus piece tells us to make a goal and be ruthless about distractions. A goal is a dream with a deadline. It needs to be specific and measurable. Dr. Amen tells our thoughts sometimes lie to us. If you think "I can't do this" or "I'll always be fat" or "I always fail" then you need to write it down and read it back and ask yourself "Is this really true?"

The idea is to think about what you are thankful for, and not dwell on negative things, because what you think about determines how you feel.

And we all need the support of others because we can't do it on willpower alone. Pastor Rick says that for a big challenge we need God's power and we need a partner. Two are better than one.

Father, you created our bodies to be temples of your spirit. Thank you for giving us food to enjoy and to nourish our bodies. Forgive us for the many times that we have misused our bodies and abused our health by the unhealthy diet that we have been following. Help us to make better choices and to learn to enjoy all the wonderful foods that you have provided that are good for us. And help us to give up the other things that we may have been using. Help us to follow your health plan for your glory. In Jesus name. Amen

There's still plenty of time to engage the <u>Ninth Triennial Gathering</u> theme, **of many generations**. You can gather <u>in-kind</u> gifts, knit or crochet a <u>prayer shawl</u> or make a quilt for the <u>quilt challenge</u>. Whether or not

you'll be attending the gathering in Charlotte, North Carolina., this July, you can gather, quilt, knit and crochet ... and pray for the participants and presenters. Prayers are invited for the participants and the presenters, that the experience may strengthen and challenge them in their faith walks. On a more tangible level, women are invited to gather in-kind gifts, make prayer shawls or participate in a quilt challenge.
