I encourage you to do your own search. You will be blessed.

John 3:16 – For God so loved the world, He gave His only begotten Son

1 John 4:19 – we love Him because He first loved us

Ephesians 5:25 – husbands love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church

Hebrews 13:1 – *let brotherly love continue* 

Leviticus 19:18 – but thou shall love thy neighbor as thyself

Proverbs 17:17 – a friend loveth at all times

Matthew 5:44 – love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you

Solomon 8:6 – *for love is as strong as death* 

Galations 5:13 – *by love serve one another* 

Thessalonians 1:3 – remembering without ceasing your work of faith, and labour of love

# THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE
